#### City of Clay Center Proposal to Increase Local Sales and Use Tax Rate

Shall the governing body of the incorporated municipality – the City of Clay Center – increase the local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%) from the current rate of one percent (1%) to a rate of one and one-half percent (1 ½%) and impose a sales and use tax at the increased rate upon the same transactions within such municipality on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax?

FOR an additional 1/2% sales tax in the City of Clay Center AGAINST an additional 1/2% sales tax in the

City of Clay Center

A "FOR" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor of increasing such local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%) to a rate of one and onehalf percent (1 ½%), then the governing body of such incorporated municipality-the City of Clay Center-shall be empowered as provided by Section 77-27,142 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes and shall forthwith proceed to increase the local sales and use tax rate from one percent (1%) to one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) and impose a sales and use tax at the increased rate upon the same transactions within such municipality on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax, pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act.

An "AGAINST" Vote: If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to such an increase of the local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%), then the governing body of the incorporated municipality shall not impose such a tax increase and the local sales and use tax rate will remain unchanged at one percent (1%).

Additional Information Regarding Proposed Local Sales and Use Tax Rate Increase:

List of reductions or elimination of other taxes or fees, if any: There is not contemplated at this time to be any elimination of other taxes or fees should a majority of those voting on such question be in favor of increasing the local sales and use tax rate.

Projects to be funded, in whole or in part. from the revenue collected: Revenues from the increased sales and use tax are to be used for such community and infrastructure projects as are allowed pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act.
